## About The Able Trust's High School High Tech Program

The Able Trust HSHT program provides high school students with various types of disabilities the opportunity to explore jobs or postsecondary education leading to successful careers.

The program is designed to: 1) improve participation in education, vocational and employment-related activities for youths with disabilities: 2) increase their enrollment in postsecondary education and training: and 3) help them identify and pursue a successful career path. During the 2018-2019 school year, The Able Trust HSHT program served 1,250 students with disabilities at 43 sites in 40 counties and achieved a graduation rate of 99% for all participating seniors.
